[The Spirituality of Personal, Social Learning: Becoming a fully human being.](#)

As the College undertakes to implement a Personal Social Learning program (PSL), providing skills and tips for our students to manage their many challenges, it is significant to draw attention to its spirituality, which is based on the unity of body and soul. There is a non-bodily aspect of our humanity – such as the temperament, our capacity for love, for beauty, our freedom and desire – which cannot be reduced to chemical processes and the nerves in the brain, important as these surely are. The soul is what makes each of us totally unique, and is where God lives in us, in our spirit. Even Jesus, who is God, has a human soul.

Within the context of the PSL it is important to place God first, because He who created us as humans will therefore help us to become more fully human. Jesus calls us to freely invite God's Spirit into our lives every day – "I stand at the door knocking." The Holy Spirit is our help. He will give us the inspiration and strength to help us in our studies, in our time management, in our eating and sleeping, our exercising, our social interactions, our use of technology, dealing with stress, and so on. The good way of balancing all these things appropriately must begin with and always include prayer, not just saying prayers automatically, but prayer which opens our lives up to God and to his grace, and to his teaching: "Jesus, live in me. Let me live in you."

In practice this means for Catholics to prayerfully attend Sunday Mass, where we listen to God speaking to us and allow his Word to shape our lives, as well as to go to Holy Communion to become one with Jesus so that He lives in us and we live in Him. It also means going to the sacrament of mercy and healing with a priest, because our sins wound and damage us, and distort our true humanity. This sacrament, however, restores us and strengthens us for the journey. And it makes us live out our vocations more fruitfully, as well as help others to do so.

Serving others, materially and spiritually, enables us to become ourselves via the very gift of ourselves. Pope Francis is recommending in this "Year of Mercy" to live mercy: "Let us rediscover these corporal works of mercy: to feed the hungry; give drink to the thirsty; clothe the naked; welcome the stranger; heal the sick; to visit the imprisoned; and bury the dead. And let us not forget the spiritual works of mercy: to counsel the doubtful, instruct the ignorant, admonish sinners, comfort the afflicted, forgive offences, bear patiently those who do us ill, and pray for the living and the dead."

If we do these things we become more human. Let love be our goal.

## ENGLISH



As you are no doubt aware, last week the College celebrated the exceptional achievements of our graduating students who achieved an ATAR Score of 90 or above. The annual 90+ Assembly is a wonderful opportunity to honour the hard work and dedication of those young men and it was particularly gratifying to see so many English successes, from across our three disciplines of English, Literature and English Language, represented amongst that group. Special mention must go to College Dux, Robert Todesco, and Renn opt Hoog, who attained outstanding study scores in both English and Literature. It is clear that a strong foundation in English study can lead to fantastic overall accomplishment, with these two boys ranked the highest of their cohort.

With this in mind, I would like to recall some messages from Robert's Dux speech, which is reprinted in full in this Newsletter, and emphasise the value in his advice to our younger students. Robert acknowledged the 'unexpected edge' that reading had given him as he undertook VCE study, and recognised that the exposure to quality writing, ideas and vocabulary had provided him with the skills needed to perform at the highest level. To the English teachers listening in the audience, his words were music to our ears, and they certainly echo the messages that we strive to instil. Regular reading, begun from an early age and sustained across childhood and the teenage years, is arguably the best advantage and the best form of support that you can give to your child. Without realising it, when your son or daughter is reading, they are acquiring the language competencies and thinking skills needed to navigate the various personal, social, academic and professional challenges they will encounter. It is for such reasons that we mandate reading as part of English study and homework. Please ensure that your son takes responsibility for his reading commitments and encourage him to read often and widely. The benefits really are immeasurable.

As we reflect on the previous year, it is hard to believe that we are already well into Term One. Our new senior students are preparing for their first written SACs and junior students are well under way with their text studies. Year 11 students are grappling with the demands of Shakespeare's Macbeth, and look forward to welcoming the ever-entertaining theatre company, 'The Flying Bookworm', who will perform and analyse key scenes from the play. Meanwhile, Year 12 students have just participated in the first of our new program of English Study Sessions, designed to help students maximise their performance in VCE English. The dates of these sessions will be published in the official 2016 SAC calendar and will offer expert tuition and targeted advice. For each SAC there will be a tutorial aimed at students seeking to improve their confidence and attainment, and there will be a separate tutorial for those aspiring to achieve a study score of 40+. Elsewhere, our Year 7s are busy delivering their first Public Speaking assignments before embarking on a new literacy unit designed to ensure their core skills are ready for the demands of Secondary education. Whilst in Years 8, 9 and 10, the boys are studying The Dons, persuasive writing and To Kill a Mockingbird respectively.

## ONLY YEAR 7 IMMUNISATIONS IN 2016

Parents of older children may be aware that in previous years vaccinations were given to students in years 7 to 10. However, the vaccine program for secondary students has been simplified this year so that all vaccines will only be offered to Year 7 students. This includes:

- Diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis combined vaccine (dTp) – one dose
- Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine – three doses
- Varicella (chicken pox) vaccine – one dose

Parents of Year 7 students should look out for the vaccine consent card booklet coming home from school with your child. You need to read, complete and return Part A regardless of whether your child is being vaccinated at school.

The Monash Council immunisation service may contact you about the Secondary School Vaccine Program. Schools are authorised to provide parent/guardian contact details to local councils for this purpose. Contact the Mazenod College health centre nurses on 8561 1159 by 29th February 2016 if you do not want your contact details given to the Monash Council immunisation service.
