Dear Mazenod Community,

This week our College House Masses continued in the lead up to Founder's Day Mass on the 26th May. At the end of Mass a representative from each House shared a reflection. This week we heard about:

Fr Charles Albini OMI (1790-1839) an Italian Oblate who dedicated his life to the formation of Priests and preaching Parish Missions in Corsica.

Blessed Joseph Gerard (1831-1914), was ordained a deacon by St Eugene and was sent to South Africa where he was later ordained a Priest. Gerard was sent to work amongst the Zulu people and it was only after many years of dedicated work that he established the Church in Lesotho. He is the Patron Saint of South Africa.

Bishop Grandin OMI (1829-1902) was sent to work in Canada, the first overseas mission of the Oblates, at a very young age. He was made the Bishop of St Alberta (now the Archdiocese of Edmonton) at the age of 28, and his ministry was devoted to the First Nations in Canada and was renowned for his kindness.

Bishop Charlebois OMI (1862-1933) was born in Canada and joined the Oblates of Mary Immaculate. For sixteen years he lived alone at Cumberland working amongst the first nations under difficult conditions. Named Vicar Apostolic of Keewatin 1910, he laboured at the difficult task of organising his vast vicariate.

On Sunday 21st May we officially celebrate the Feast of St Eugene, for obvious reasons we are celebrating it here at the College on Friday. Eugene de Mazenod was born on August 1, 1782, at Aix-en-Provence in France. Eugene was born into a privileged family but he experienced the upheaval of the French Revolution. After most of his childhood was spent as refugees throughout Italy he returned to France and entered the seminary. Following his ordination he returned to work in his home town of Aix-en-Provence. Eugene directed his ministry toward the poorest of the poor and especially youth who had lost their way. Others joined his mission, and became the nucleus of a religious community, the Missionaries of Provence. Later Eugene was named Bishop of Marseille. At the Official recognition of the Congregation it was renamed the Oblates of Mary Immaculate, and in 1841 the Oblates sailed for missions in five continents, arriving in Fremantle, Australia, in 1894. After a life dedicated to spreading the Good News, Eugene died on May 21, 1861. He was beatified by Pope Paul VI in 1975 and Canonised by John Paul II in 1995.

The Feast of St Eugene also marks the start of the annual novena for Oblate Vocations. From 21st - 29th May, Missionary Oblate communities, members of the Oblate family and parishes around the world are encouraged to participate in actions of prayer and reflection for vocations to Oblate life and mission. 21st May is the Feast of St. Eugene and May 29 is the anniversary of Blessed Joseph Gerard, the Oblate Missionary who worked in Lesotho. With this in mind I invite you to join the Oblates in praying for Oblate vocations.

Prayer for Vocations

Loving God, You Called St Eugene  
to send forth missionaries to proclaim  
and live the Gospel among the poor.  
Increase our love, we pray, for those  
who are most abandoned. Extend your  
loving Call to many young people  
in our community and grant them  
the desire to give of themselves, their  
lives, and their talents to the service of  
Jesus Christ and the Church. May our  
young people answer your call as Missionary  
Oblates of Mary Immaculate  
to serve those who are in need.  
This we ask through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The 21st May is also the most appropriate day to commence a three day gathering of the Australian Province of the Oblates of Mary Immaculate. Forty-two Oblates will be participating in the Congress to discuss the future direction of the Australian Province. I ask that you keep all the Oblates in your prayers as we spend these days together open to God Spirit discerning the future.

Next week Musicians from Mazenod WA and Iona QLD will be visiting and participating in a combined Music Program to mark our 50th Anniversary. This will culminate in the our Founder's Day Mass, Friday 26th May, and it would be great to have parents and extended family to join us in this important celebration. During the week Fr Michael Twigg and the new lay Principal of Mazenod WA, Mr Andrew Watson will be visiting and join the Music Program and our celebrations.

On Wednesday 24th May the Mothers & Fathers Association will be hosting a Combined Meeting, with a number of presenters, it will be an opportunity to examine a little more closely the designs of the new building and the vision for the College which will take us to 2020.

Tomorrow the College will come alive with the Founder's Day Sport Carnival, with Mazenod Old Collegians Football Club, Mazenod United Football Club, Mazenod Volleyball Club and assisted by the Mazenod Old Collegians Cricket Club. If your sons are coming please encourage them to wear their rain jackets even if there is no "condensed moisture of the atmosphere falling visibly in separate drops" or more commonly referred to as rain. It would be great to have a sea of Blue, Black and White supporting all out teams.

The 2017 Annual Father Son Communion Dinner will be held at the College on Friday, 2nd June beginning with Mass at 7 p.m. followed by Dinner in the Founders' Complex. After great anticipation, the vacant carpark was filled with site sheds, forty year old trees were bulldozed, the memorial cross removed and the demolition commenced. On Friday the 5th of May our Year 12 students travelled to the Caulfield Racecourse to attend the Annual Careers Expo. Over 130 exhibitors

provided information and resources for the students that came from all corners of Victoria. The purpose of such as expo was to enhance students understanding of what is on offer after their journey through Secondary school finishes. While some may criticise the time lost from class, or the cost involved in gaining admission and transporting 200 students to this event, we can never underestimate the benefits that this type of occasion has in laying the foundations for a young man's future after school. The number of opportunities and institutes available for a student to continue his development after his formal schooling is staggering, and while this is just the beginning of their life journey, there will be many more career interviews, open days and information sessions to come. The foundations for our students' futures have been laid.

This week sees the beginning of our Patrons' masses, masses to honour the Oblate Saints of which our sporting Houses are named. Though this disrupts the Year Level routine that our mass roster is based upon, it lays the foundation for one of the most important celebrations in the College's calendar, that of Founders' Day. In this our 50th year, Founders' Day is one where we will host visitors from our fellow Oblate Colleges, Iona College in Queensland and Mazenod Western Australia. ## INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Since writing an article on the IT Curriculum last year there has been some current and future changes.

Firstly the Faculty will be renamed Digital Technologies. The Faculty is in the process of aligning its courses with the new Victorian Curriculum Digital Technologies. This year also sees the implementation of STEM Robotics at Year 9 level.

In 2016 the new VCAA Study Computing was implemented across the faculty. Essentially it is made up of VCE Computing Units 1 and 2, VCE Software Development Units 3 and 4 and VCE Informatics units 3 and 4. Parts of the assessed curriculum includes hypothesis, different types of surveys, planning and presenting results and conclusions in a digital form.

Next Tuesday will see the annual ICAS Computer Skills competition take place. In previous years it has been known as the "Computer Skills Competition" and Year 9 and Year 10 students have participated. This year there are some changes. The format, number of questions and content have not changed. As was the case last year our young men were ranked against other students across Australia. The new name will be "ICAS Digital Technologies Competition". With the introduction of the laptop program this year the number of students has swelled. At Year 7, 44 students have been selected at random to participate. Over the last two weeks we have been busy working with these students; familiarising them with the format of the competition and providing opportunities for our young men to prepare for the types of questions on the paper. Year 9 students number 53, this being a major increase since last year, and Year 10 45, again an increase from last year. There is a high level of anticipation of excellent results when our young men are ranked against other students Australia wide. Results for each participant will be handed to them early August.

I had the fortune of being thanked by a parent of an ex-student on MAD Day. His son had gone down the Software Development Curriculum pathway finishing his VCE here in 2016. His father asked me to thank his IT teachers. His son was at University studying a course that was not IT specific but has a programming component in it. The subject was over seven weeks and the student's lecturer told our ex-student after one week that he did not need to attend the rest of the course, such was the excellent standard of his skills and knowledge. So I acknowledge and thank all the IT Curriculum teachers on his behalf.

The decision to offer the first year of the VCE VET Certificate II in Interactive Digital Media has been a wise one. Our students are using Premier Pro to produce interactive video content in their tasks to gain their competencies.

## SEVERE ALLERGIES

Some students at Mazenod College have severe allergies making them at risk of an anaphylactic reaction. An anaphylactic reaction is an allergic response and is a life-threatening medical emergency. These students need to avoid whatever it is that causes their allergy. Food allergies, including to nuts and eggs, are the most common risk at Mazenod College. Allergies to insect venom such as bee stings are a risk to some students. We encourage the students at risk of anaphylaxis to tell their friends about their allergy, as it is these peers who are most likely to be present in an emergency. Students with serious allergies should bring their own, safe food from home.

As a school community, we can help by: knowing the serious nature of anaphylaxis, being alert when a student complains of allergy symptoms and refraining from sharing food with students who have food allergies. All students are encouraged to wash their hands before meals. Appropriate treatment must also be readily available. "Anaphylaxis action kits" for these students are kept at school and at home. The kit is made up by the family and contains an action plan and an adrenaline auto injector device such as an "EpiPen\*". Antihistamine tablets may also be included in the action kit. 


