During the holidays I was fortunate to attend a Boys' Education Conference with Mr Patrick Lambert, Ms Jacinta Fox and Mr David May. The Conference was held in Christ Church Grammar School, Western Australia on the theme of Character Education in Boys' Schools. It was coordinated by the International Coalition of Boys Schools, of which Mazenod College is a member. Some of the topics covered were: The perilous world where boys become men; health and well-being of young men; the character of elite performance; Schools on character; and Student Voices. I found the Conference to be extremely valuable, challenging and affirming. Conferences such as these help form new ideas; connect with other boys Schools across Australia as well as the world and challenge pre-existing theories. The speakers were excellent and the discussion was fruitful.

The Conference challenged us to help the boys recognise the affect that they have on us and the way that they engage is a great demonstration of character. One of the interesting realisations is that our Old Boy community is where we will best see whether the experience of Mazenod has been a fruitful one that has helped build men of good character.

We are extremely blessed to have a Mazenod Old Collegians Association; Mazenod Old Collegians Cricket, Football and Football (Soccer) Clubs as well opportunities through mentoring, Chess, Music, Volleyball and Table Tennis. As a College, we commit to

UNDEGRADUATE MEDICINE & HEALTH SCIENCES ADMISSION TEST 2013:

DON'T MISS THE UMAT!

The Undergraduate Medicine and Health Sciences Admission Test (UMAT) is used to assist in the selection of students into medicine and some health science degree programs at undergraduate level.

Who is required to sit UMAT?

Australian citizens, permanent residents and New Zealand citizens applying for the following undergraduate courses must complete the UMAT:

- Medicine/Surgery
- Physiotherapy
- Pharmacy
- Pharmacy/Commerce

Every year a handful of students, who want to study medicine, pharmacy or health sciences such as physiotherapy find they can't apply because they didn't know they had to sit the UMAT. It is a huge disappointment for those students, but something that is easily avoided. Some of the universities that require UMAT include:

- The University of Adelaide Medicine, Dental Surgery, Oral Health
- Flinders University Clinical Sciences/BMBS, Vision Sciences
- Charles Darwin University Clinical Sciences
- Bond University Medicine
- Monash University Medicine, Physiotherapy,
- La Trobe University Health Science (Dentistry), Oral Health Science
- The University of Newcastle/University of New England Joint Medical Program
- The University of NSW Medicine, Optometry

- The University of Tasmania Medicine
- The University of Queensland Medical (provisional entry), Dental Science
- The University of Western Australia Medicine, Dental Medicine
- University of Western Sydney Medicine
- The University of Auckland, NZ Medicine
- University of Otago, NZ Medicine, Dental Surgery, Medical Laboratory Science, Physiotherapy

What does the UMAT involve?

UMAT is a prerequisite for a number of courses. It is an independent test run on behalf of a consortium of universities and run only once a year – in 2013 the date is **Wednesday 31 July 2013**. UMAT tests skills in three constructs: *Logical Reasoning and Problem Solving*, *Interpersonal Understanding and Non-verbal Reasoning*, and will no longer be divided and timed separately. Candidates will be given 3 hours to complete the test.

UMAT registration and preparation

Registrations for UMAT open in April and **close Friday 7 June 2013 at 5pm**. Late entries, which attract an extra fee, are accepted until Friday 21 June. If students miss out, they have to wait until the following year. So, it is vitally important to make sure anyone considering medicine, dentistry or health sciences registers for the test.

Preparing for UMAT

ACER produces the only official UMAT Preparation materials and these are available online through the UMAT website. Please note that the practice materials can only be completed online. There are two tests available: **UMAT Practice Test 1** and **UMAT Practice Test 2**. UMAT Practice Test 1 will be included with the UMAT2013 Registration. A new publication, Additional Practice Questions, will be released for purchase in April and a notice will be placed on the ACER website when it becomes available.

Please note:

- This year ACER will be conducting UMAT Information Sessions at a number of UMAT Consortium Universities and students who are interested in sitting the test and applying to medical school are encouraged to attend. Details about the sessions will be released on the website and on the websites of the Universities hosting sessions. Below is a list of confirmed Victorian dates and locations:
 - **Monash University, 13th May 2013**
- Candidates must be in at least their **final year of schooling**, or above, to be eligible to sit UMAT i.e. they must be completing, or already have completed, Year 12 in 2013. Year 11 students or students competing Year 12 over two years are NOT permitted to sit UMAT. Candidates found to have sat UMAT in Year 11 will have their results cancelled and will not be allowed to sit UMAT again.
- **Student ID cards are not accepted as appropriate photo identification.** The only forms of identification accepted by ACER include:
 - A current passport issued within 2 years
 - Current driver's licence or learner's permit (photo bearing)

- Current (photo-bearing) Keypass, Proof of Age Card or 18+ Card
- A certified letter of identification from the College
- Candidates with a visual, hearing, physical or other impairment who apply for **special testing conditions** must do so in writing, no later than Friday 21 June 2013.
- Candidates registering for the Concession Registration Fee and/or unable to pay by credit card must return their proof of concession and/or money order within 2 weeks of registering or but the registration deadline (whichever comes first).
